

Questions from the Survey

1. What will recess and Phys-Ed be like for the students?
 - a. To begin the year, recess and Phys-Ed will be outside. When there is inclement weather, a lesson will be done in the classroom. While there are pros to utilizing the gymnasium, we are not comfortable using that for Phys-Ed or recess to begin the year.
2. Will the computer lab and other shared classrooms be sanitized between classes?
 - a. We are not intending on using the computer lab for daily instruction. Mrs. Garcia will conduct lessons in the classroom.
3. How will dismissal and departure work to encourage social distancing? What about the lining up of children?
 - a. We are currently working on a plan for dismissal, it will look different. In the past we have released 3 grade levels at a time. We are looking at releasing one grade out of the front door (Harvest) and one grade out of the side door (Sylvania) and not releasing the next group until it appears safe to do so.
4. Will children still be using lockers? What about social distancing during locker access? Will lockers be assigned so that each class is spaced out from being side by side at any given time?
 - a. Since students will not be switching classes, the lockers will be used to house coats, backpacks, and lunches. Teachers will send students out in small groups to prevent congestion. Lockers will be assigned, and siblings in classrooms nearby will share a locker.
5. Will children only bring in bagged lunches? What procedures/safeties will be in place if outside foods (fast food orders) are delivered and distributed to kids?
 - a. We will offer hot lunch again. Hot lunches will be wrapped or in to-go containers prior to being delivered to the classroom. In order for us to use vendors, there are requirements set forth by the health department. We will make sure that those are met.

6. Will masks be required and will there be restrictions (a dress code) concerning styles and colors?
 - a. Masks will be required for all students when they enter the building, leave the building, and enter common areas such as the hallway or restroom. The teachers will designate a mask on/ mask off time depending on what is being done. We will finalize a dress code for masks soon.
7. Will an option be offered for students to take all classes online if they are not able to return to in person classes for medical or safety reasons?
 - a. Yes, a distance-learning option will be available for students.
8. How will the school monitor arrival and dismissal times, causing crowding in the hallways?
 - a. We are going to allow students to enter their classroom 15 minutes earlier than years past (7:15 compared to 7:30). Dismissal was addressed in point 3.
9. Is school able to adhere to the social distance suggestion of 6 feet, 3 feet or no distance?
 - a. The CDC and American Association of Pediatrics asks that schools strive for 6 feet, but do what makes sense to get all students into the building. By utilizing the 3-person pods, the students will be 3 feet away from those within their pod (separated by plastic barriers) and the pods will be spaced 4.5 – 6 feet apart.
10. If a child needs to quarantine for 14 days, how will they receive quality instruction?
 - a. We have a task team working diligently to ensure that we offer quality instruction for distance- learning. Distance-learning will consist of instructional videos recorded by the teacher as well as Zoom sessions to go over homework and offer further assistance.
11. If wearing a mask is required, will there be restrictions on styles? A mask dress code?
 - a. We are still working through this and I hope to have an answer for you by the beginning of August.
12. Will there be PE?

- a. Yes, PE will be offered as that is a great opportunity for students to be outside. To start the year, we will not allow PE in the gym, we will continue to assess that throughout the year.
13. Will there still be fast food lunches to order or will bagged lunches be required?
- a. We will offer hot lunches from vendors that are approved by the health departments. Hot lunches will be delivered to the classrooms in to-go containers or packaging.
14. Will students eat in the lunchroom?
- a. No, students will eat lunch in their classroom.
15. Will there still be recess?
- a. Yes, it is very important for the students to be outside when able to. While at recess, your child will only be with the students in his/her class.
16. What safeties will be in place for respecting social distancing while accessing lockers?
- a. When going to lockers for coat, backpack, or lunch box, teachers will send students in small groups to ensure social distancing, and masks will be required.
17. Will all volunteers have their temperature taken before permitted to help?
- a. Volunteers will not be permitted in the building unless there is an emergency.
18. What would happen if someone at the school tests positive for COVID?
- a. We have been instructed that should a student or staff member test positive for COVID-19, they are to self-quarantine for 10 from when they first experienced symptoms, and 3 days symptom free.
19. When it comes to face shields for teachers/staff, are you recommending cloth masks or face shields or either?
- a. Per the Lucas County Health Department, face shields and cloth masks are approved for teachers.
20. Will there be Extended Day for before and after school?
- a. We are planning on having Extended Day. We are waiting for further directives before implementing how Extended Day will work.

21. Will there be any special precautions for students who are at higher risk because of their own health conditions, or who live with someone who is at higher risk?
 - a. We ask that all families who are at higher risk communicate with school administration to ensure that all precautions are taken. It is important to us that all families who wish to send their children to school feel comfortable and safe doing so.
22. Under what circumstances would the school return to full-time distance learning, and how would that decision be made?
 - a. We will follow the directives set forth by the governor and health department. In the past, if a certain percent of our population was absent due to illness we closed school for a minimum number of days. We will continue to keep up with the mandates and recommendations for this.
23. What would distance-learning look like?
 - a. We are still working through this, but the goal of distance learning is to emulate in class learning as much as possible. It will consist of instructional videos recorded by the teacher as well as Zoom sessions to go over homework and offer further assistance. It will be a seamless transition from in-school instruction.
24. If fully computer-based, would there be accommodations for children who can't handle much screen time, or parents who don't have devices available for children to use?
 - a. The screen time that is used is designed to offer clarification and instruction to the content being taught. The work that is done by the student can be done by pencil and paper. We ask that all families that are in need of an additional device please contact Mr. Urbanski.
25. Do we have a plan in place when the first child tests positive for COVID?
 - a. We have been directed to inform all families when a student tests positive for COVID-19. The classroom the child was in will be shared, but the name of the child will **not**. That child will be required to self-quarantine for 10 days from when he or she began showing symptoms, and must be 3-days symptom-free to return. Students considered exposed to the child will also have to self-quarantine for 14 days.

26. Will the kids have to share a locker?
- a. We are hoping that we will be able to maximize locker usage by only having siblings whose classrooms are nearby share lockers.
27. Will Mask be required and the students practicing 6ft distancing?
- a. Masks will be required for students in grades K-8 in all common areas.
 - i. Students in grades K-2 have been given more flexibility for having to wear masks in the classroom. They will be at a seat with a desk shield.
 - ii. Grades 3-8 have been given more strict guidelines for wearing masks during the school day. There will be breaks from wearing masks while eating lunch, being outside, or (per the permission of the classroom teacher) when taking a test or doing silent seatwork.
28. What are the plans for school Masses?
- a. School Masses will be held on Wednesday afternoons. One grade will attend Mass and will sit socially-distanced; the other grades will have the Mass live-streamed.
29. What if a child has a cough or cold, can they still attend school? If not how long do they need to stay home? Can they do remote-learning during that time?
- a. Per the Lucas County Health Department, we have been advised that each family should consult with their family physician about whether it is safe to come to school. Whenever a student is required to stay at home, we will provide an online-learning opportunity that is intended to be a seamless transition as a student goes from in-person to online, then online back to in-person.
30. What is the school protocol if a student, family member, teacher or staff has either tested positive or been exposed?
- a. Any student or staff member that tests positive is required to self-quarantine 10 days since first experiencing symptoms and be symptom-free for 3 days symptom free. Should a student be exposed to someone who tested positive, he/she is to self-quarantine for 14 days.

31. Will there be a three-tier plan to include various levels of stages (face-to-face, combination, and full distance-learning schooling) to address another full outbreak or in school quarantines?
 - a. We did explore the idea of such a plan. After consulting with our teams and the Lucas County Health Department, we find it unlikely to utilize a hybrid model such as an A/B schedule, but will continue to research and discuss what that would look like at Christ the King. We plan on offering in-class instruction as long as it is safe and possible.
32. How will social distancing be followed?
 - a. There will not be hallway traffic as there has been in years past, and there will be decals on the floor spread 6-feet apart. Students will remain in their classroom thus not interacting with students from other classes. Students will sit in 3-person pods where they are separated by 3 feet and Plexiglas (see images). The pods themselves will also be 4.5-6 feet apart.
33. Will kids be stuck in seats all day?
 - a. Per the governor's request, in order to best practice social distancing, students should be in their seats for most of the day. We will be incorporating morning and afternoon recess periods as an opportunity to move around.
34. How will specials be done/recess/lunch?
 - a. Specials and lunch will be in the child's classroom. Recess will be outside.
35. How will the middle school function?
 - a. Middle school students will remain in their classroom and the teachers will rotate to them.
36. Are you considering a 2-day-on/3-day-off plan?
 - a. We did explore this option, and will continue to see what it would look like at Christ the King. Our goal is to continue to have face-to-face instruction five days-a-week in the safest way possible.
37. What do you need from parents to help create a safe situation?
 - a. Thank you for asking this question. All that we ask from parents is an open line of communication with any concerns

- i. Patience and understanding that we are doing the best we can by consulting with professionals for the health, safety, and well-being of all children and staff.
 - ii. Assistance in communication with our children not to come to school in fear. If your children know that you are comfortable with them coming to school, they will be more comfortable coming to school.
- 38. What precautions will be taken in regards to masks (worn all day), social distancing and temperatures?
 - a. Students tend to do well with rules, and if they are enforced early it becomes routine for them. While it may be a challenge for students at the beginning of the year, teachers are to enforce masks to stay on and remain in their seat unless given permission otherwise. Temperatures will be checked upon arrival.
- 39. How can interpersonal relationships be maintained with students and teachers?
 - a. I think we can all agree that our teachers do a great job in creating interpersonal relationships with their students when in the classroom. I think we can also agree that those positive interpersonal relationships were not the same when we were forced into distance-learning. This is an area where teachers and staff (myself included) need to improve for the students who utilize distance-learning. We did hire three intervention assistants to assist with classroom instruction as well as remote learning.
- 40. What is the procedure for assuring staff health prior to start of work each day?
 - a. Similar to other businesses, we will ask all employees to do a self-assessment prior to coming to school.
- 41. What happens if a kid becomes sick at school? Is there isolation space available to accommodate the child awaiting pick up while also keeping staff and other students safe?
 - a. Should a child become sick at school, we will have an isolation space where he/she is away from other students and staff. We have a couple options on where that will be, but it will be away from others.

42. Is there a schedule for required handwashing after recesses and before eating?
- The teachers in the younger grades have always done a good job in designating times for their classroom to use the restroom and wash their hands. We will set up a similar schedule for the older grades, and will also have plenty of hand sanitizer to use throughout the day as well.
43. How will you handle student birthday celebrations?
- Unfortunately this year we will not allow birthday treats. Students can still dress down on their birthday.
44. Will students share any classroom equipment and how will it be sanitized?
- We are currently talking to the teachers about having designated manipulatives or equipment for each student. Anything that is collected will be properly sanitized right away.
45. How will the school safely supply drinking water?
- Drinking fountains will be disabled. Bottle filling stations will be working and we encourage students to bring their own personal water bottle.
46. Will students be required to wear masks while singing during Mass?
- There is still discussion on whether or not we will have singing in Mass. We may begin the year with hymns.
47. Who will be responsible for taking over the classes?
- Should a teacher be required to self-quarantine, we believe that we can utilize other teachers in the building to cover.
48. What can be done to ensure everyone is taking quarantine, cleanliness, and masks seriously to prevent transmission at school?
- Based on the survey, we found that families have varying levels of concern over COVID-19. Father Bill, Nurse J, Mrs. Rosengarten and I are going to make difficult decisions that we believe are in the best interest of our students, staff, and families. As a community, we hope that everyone understands and respects the effort we are taking to keep our Christ the King family safe and healthy.
49. With more e-learning inevitable, is there a plan for all students to receive equipment to attend classes/complete tasks/assignments?

- a. Last year we had enough technology to lend out everyone who requested a device. We have ordered more Chromebooks as well.
50. Will students be allowed to attend Mass with the public?
- a. No, we will no longer have our Kindergarten and First-grade students attend the 8am Mass with the public.
51. Will temperature checks be required to enter school?
- a. Yes, we do ask that families check their children's temperature before coming to school, but we will have temperature checks at the door.
52. What are the qualifiers for being healthy enough to attend school?
- a. Nurse J. will provide a detailed health symptom guide to families when assessing if a child is healthy to attend school. The health symptom guide will follow the CDC and the Lucas County Health Department guidelines. We also recommend that you consult with your family physician.
53. Will additional disinfecting procedures be implemented to ensure all bathrooms and common spaces remain clean?
- a. Bathrooms and common areas will be cleaned minimum of twice a day.
54. How will the library function?
- a. We are hoping to have families use a program so books can be reserved and delivered to a child's classroom. All books returned will be sanitized prior to being put back on the shelf.
55. Will the 24-hour fever-free rule still apply, or will it be a longer period of time?
- a. New recommendations are **at least** 48 hours. We will share this with you when we get further directives.
56. What type of sanitization is going to be done & what type of frequency?
- a. Common areas will be cleaned twice daily, student working areas daily, and a thorough cleaning with Clorox 360 sprayer will be done weekly.
57. Will there still be CYO sports?
- a. As of now, CYO is still planning on having sports.
58. Will kindergartners be at school every day?

- a. Yes, grades K-8 will be all day every day, and preschool will be whatever they signed up for.
59. If someone tests positive for COVID-19, what will be the process for that individual student and the teacher/staff/other students that student came in contact with?
- a. Per the Lucas County Health Department, anyone who tests positive for COVID-19 must go into quarantine for 10 days from when they started experiencing symptoms and be symptom-free for three days. All others who are considered exposed to the individual based on the Lucas County Health Department Guidelines will also have to self-quarantine. This would not result in a stay-at-home order for the entire class.
60. If a teacher tests positive, what will the process be for those students they came in contact with?
- a. Should a teacher test positive, the families will be informed and will have the *option* to utilize online learning but are not required.
61. What is the process for continuing the educational process?
- a. In the event that we go to a distance-learning format, we will utilize a simple online learning platform where teacher videos and assignments are given, along with other programs. There will also be Zoom sessions available for better one on one or small-group assistance.
62. How often will teacher/students be tested?
- a. At the current time, we do not have the ability to test teachers or students for COVID-19. A physician's order is needed to do a COVID-19 test.
63. Will there be space between desks areas-what about shared tables such as in the science building?
- a. Students will sit in 3-person pods separated by Plexiglas. Tables in the science lab will not be used.
64. What about entry into the school at drop off and movement to and on buses?
- a. Students entering the building will need to have their temperature checked. Students utilizing Sylvania or Washington Local buses will have to abide by that district's rules and regulations.
